Throughout 1908 and 1909 Emily Carr took summer trips to paint in such places as Alert Bay, Campbell River, Cape Mudge on Quadra Island, Sechelt and up the Fraser River to Hope, Yale and Lytton. She was on a powerful personal quest to record the amazing First Nations' culture.
